Topic

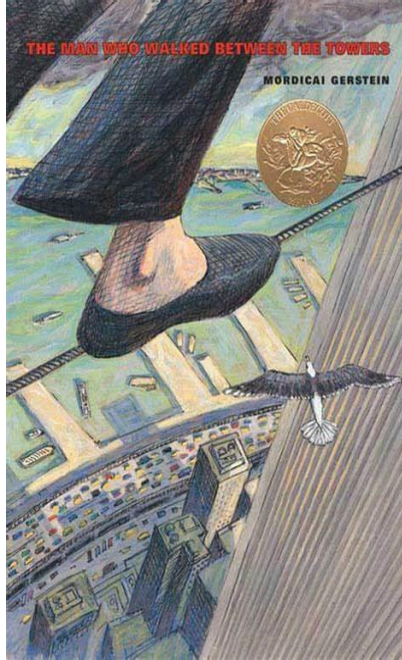
Art – To explore how artists use light to create visual effects.
